## Dr. Charles Bird, Keynote Speaker II



### **Planting Seeds: The Mission and Significance of Branch Campuses**

For decades, branch campuses provided an opportunity for place bound people to reach for a better life. In these changing times, branches can contribute even more to their communities and to advancing the goals of their institution, but we need new strategies and deeper understanding of what helps campuses thrive.

Branch campuses provide critical opportunities for people who might otherwise never realize their educational dreams. In this presentation from the heart, Dr. Bird celebrates the contributions of branch campuses, as places where seeds are planted and nourished, community development is encouraged, and institutional missions are advanced. Drawing on nearly 40 years of experience, in a variety of roles, he suggests strategies for continued growth and success, expresses his irritation with leaders who don't lead, and suggests that the work of branch campuses is not nearly complete.

**Dr. Charles "Charlie" Bird** has a strong personal and professional commitment to expanding access and opportunities for higher education. "My great love is learning and then sharing what I've learned. I don't consider myself to be especially creative, but I do think I have some talent for what I call 'connecting the dots.' So, I learn, connect the dots, and look for opportunities to share what I think I've discovered." Dr. Bird fills his days with reading, writing, speaking, exercise and activity, and most of all with friends and family. Otherwise, "If I did none of those things any more, I'd be a house plant."

Currently the vice president emeritus for University Outreach at Ohio University, Dr. Bird works as a consultant and executive coach, is founder of Encore Dreams LLC. He is author of the book, *Out on a Limb: A Branch Campus Life*.
