After years of teaching Life Skills in a correctional facility, Carol Grace was invited to do the keynote for a national educators' convention. In time, that led to a full calendar of speaking engagements for various associations and corporations across the country.

Along the way, she's had her share of challenges; when she lost her younger sister to cancer she was devastated. Instead of giving up, she decided to get fired up! 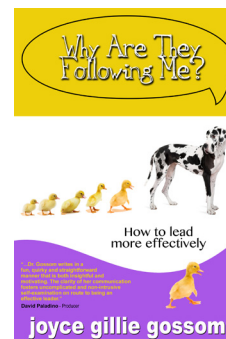
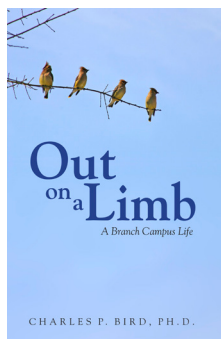

The National Student Data Clearinghouse Comes to Branch Campus Administrators

Ever wonder where your students were before they joined your branch campus? Where they went after? If they ever achieved a degree? Wonder no more! Learn about the National Student Clearinghouse.

Scott Howell, Director at Brigham Young University, BYU Salt Lake Center

Session Description:

We recently learned about the National Student Data Clearinghouse (see <http://www.studentclearinghouse.org/>) from the BYU Institutional Planning and Assessment office. Even though the presenter has worked in Higher Education for 30 years he had never before heard of it before. This office suggested we run our students at the branch campus (BYU Salt Lake Center) against it to learn more about their educational history and how the students’ stop at our campus fit into their educational journey. As soon as we learned about this possibility we knew we needed to share our findings. Some of the questions this clearinghouse is helping us answer include the following: Were these students who enrolled for a semester or two at our branch campus ever admitted to a degree-seeking program? Where were they before? Where did they go afterwards? How many institutions did they ultimately attend? Which ones? How many of them ultimately graduated with a bachelor’s degree? How long did it take them to receive a degree? Etc.

About the Speaker:

Scott L. Howell is the Director of Brigham Young University’s branch campus, BYU Salt Lake Center. He earned his PhD in Instructional Science and has worked in Higher Education for the past 28 years. He is the author of numerous articles on distance and online learning/assessment.

Multi-Campus Environments An Accreditation Perspective Heather Perfetti

One of our goals is to establish relationships with the regional accrediting bodies around issues related to branches and centers. As a result, NABCA has contacted the Middle States Association of Colleges & Schools to provide an interactive seminar focused on such things as the definitions of branches, additional locations, and other instructional sites, accreditation issues, and review team processes.

This presentation and discussion of regional accreditation and the multi-campus environment will include topics relating to institutional improvement, innovation, and accountability through the lens of peer review. It will include an overview of regional accreditation, expectations for multi-campus environments from a regulatory perspective, and insights into working across locations to support meaningful accreditation activities and holistic evaluations leading to institutional improvements.

Heather F. Perfetti, JD, EdD joined the Middle States Commission on Higher Education as Vice President liaison to institutions in January of 2015. She has since been promoted to the position of Vice President for Legal Affairs and Chief of Staff in 2017. Previous positions include Vice President for Academic Affairs at SUNY Orange (NY) and Allegany College of Maryland; Assistant Dean, Assistant Professor, and Program Coordinator at Darton College (GA); and Assistant Professor at Murray State University (KY).

She has also held adjunct faculty positions at Georgia Southern University, Barstow Community College (CA), and Darton College. Perfetti earned the Doctor of Education degree with specialization in Higher Education Leadership from Northcentral University (CA), the Juris Doctor degree from the University of Mississippi School of Law, the Master of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Troy University (AL), and Bachelor of Arts degree in English from Frostburg State University (MD).

Lessons Learned

More and more institutions need to see enrollment grow on their branch campuses. What are the essential issues to address if campuses are to thrive in a highly competitive world?

Charles “Charlie” Bird, Vice President for University Outreach Emeritus at Ohio University, N/A

Session Description:

Branch campuses have various missions and significant differences in enrollment and programs. Funding approaches, services provided, and levels of local authority vary widely. More than in the past, institutional leaders seem to recognize that they need to increase enrollment from “nontraditional” audiences, and they are asking questions about how to proceed with their branch campuses, online programs, or both. Questions about structure, funding, services, relationships with partners, and local autonomy are on the table. In this presentation, I will share lessons learned since publishing *Out on a Limb* and after visiting dozens of campuses, with an eye toward helping branch leaders identify critical conversation topics or strategies that are essential for success. Topics will range from the significance of campus origins, to the creation of revenue sharing models, to the importance of local control over certain aspects of operations and beyond.

Creating a contemporary Extended Education strategy

Explore how a multi-branch college with limited resources created a collaborative, multi-part Extended Education strategy that redefined how it educates its district. This is a case study of Shasta College.

Andrew “Andy” Fields, Dean of Extended Education at Shasta College, Tehama, Trinity, Intermountain

Session Description:

This session will explain the current Extended Education strategy of Shasta College, and the many influences and stakeholders that created it. Shasta College serves a district that encompasses three counties, over 10,000 sq. miles, and population of over 255,000. The remote and rural nature of the district has created challenges in providing educational opportunities for all students. Shasta College has been successful over the past 30 years with the use of interactive video conferencing, but it was time to rethink our approach. With resource limitations and a stretched administrative infrastructure, a new strategy was developed to transform our branch campuses into learning centers focused on student success. Although the use of interactive video conferencing still plays a significant role, it is no longer the primary focus. Today, Shasta College uses several resources and technologies to provide opportunities for students.

About the Speaker:

Dr. Andrew Fields has created, enhanced, and managed innovative programs for several colleges and universities including Stanford University, Central Washington University, CSU Hayward, UC Davis, and University of the Pacific. He currently serves as Dean of Extended Education at Shasta College. Some primary passions are education, adventure, and the outdoors.

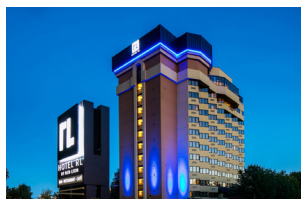

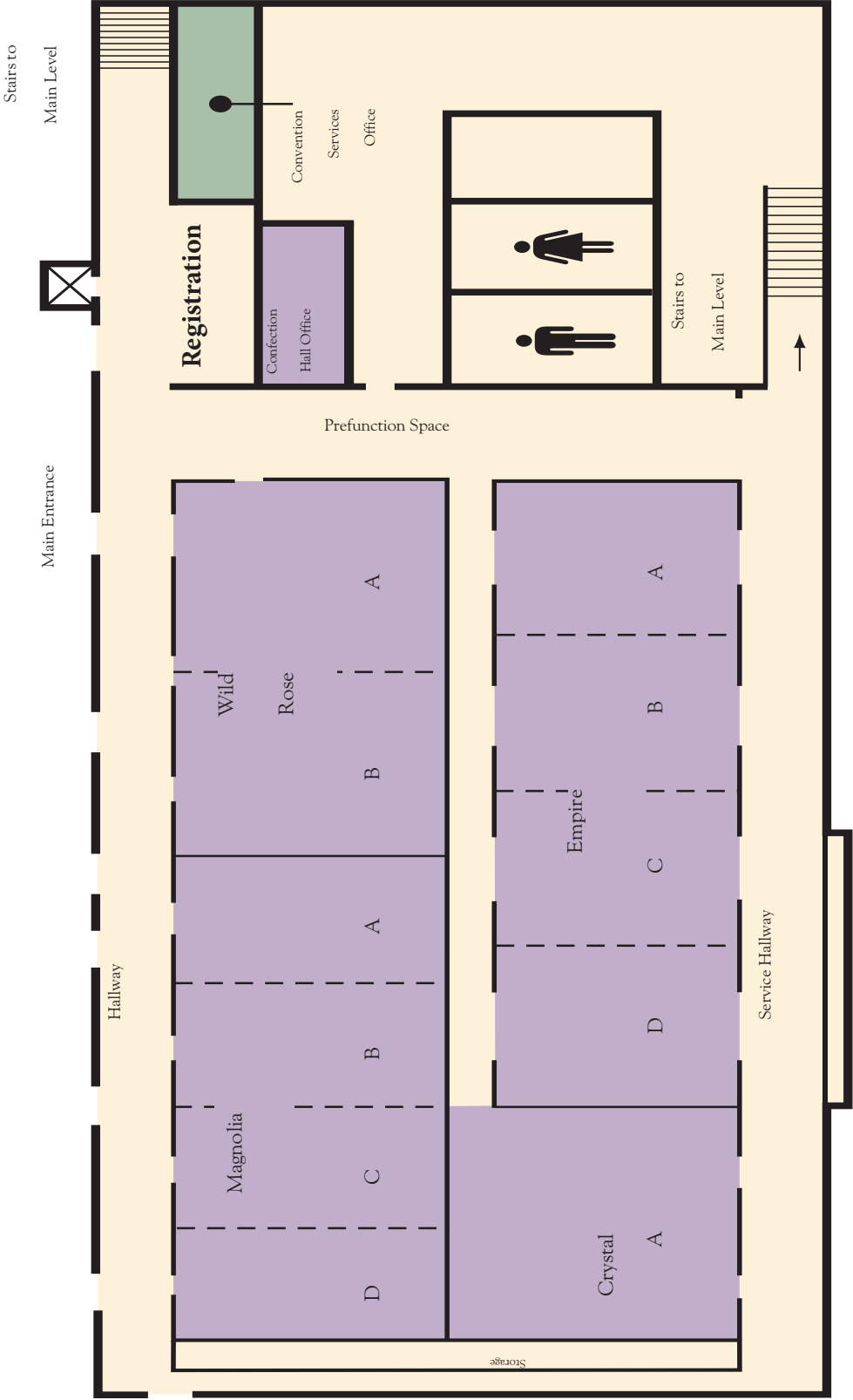

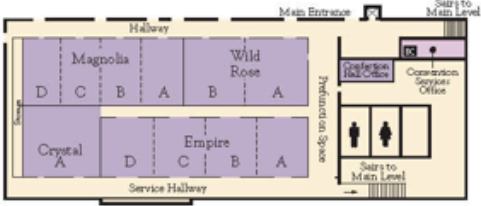
